

ASC OF AZ PRESENTS SCENT DETECTION CLINIC BY SHANE MENZ

Shane Menz started his career in Law Enforcement in 1995. He chose his first department because they had a K9 unit. He started his path to reaching his goal of being involved in K9 by being a bite decoy. Pre-9/11, he was in the process of starting the first K9 for the University of North Texas Police Department. Originally slated to be a narcotics and patrol dog, he was on duty the morning of 9/11, and the Chief of Police changed his mind and decided to have an Explosives Detection and Patrol dog. He was paired with his first K9 Partner, K9 Hektor. He ran as a loose part of a national response team until Hektor's retirement. In 2004, he joined the Lewisville Police Department. Shortly afterwards, he was paired with his first Lewisville K9, a Narcotics and Patrol dog named Kane. After K9 Kane retired, he was paired with his third K9 partner, Immo. K9 Immo was also a Narcotics and Patrol dog. K9 Immo ended up being the dog that the department used as a gauge for all future K9's for the department. His career stats were 5,250 lbs of Marijuana,

109 Kilos of Cocaine, 29 Kilos of Methamphetamine, unknown amounts of Heroin, well over \$100,000 of bulk currency, 64 "give ups" from suspects and 5 engagements by force of suspects. In 2015, K9 Immo retired, and Shane took his fourth and final K9 partner, K9 Cziko. Shane also became a K9 trainer and K9 instructor. K9 Cziko and Shane retired in 2021 together. Shane led the largest Police K9 training group in North Texas with K9 teams coming from Paris, Texas, Southern Oklahoma, as far West as Jacksboro, Texas and as far South as Cleburne, Texas.

Over the three days we will cover ASCA's new scent detection program and the rules. We will also cover odor theory and imprinting odors, with a large amount of time making sure the students have clear understanding of imprinting odor during seminar and afterwards, training safely when they're on their own, and distraction odors built into training.
